About the Children's Cancer and Leukaemia Group (CCLG)

One child in 600 develops cancer – around 1,700 new cases a year in the UK and Ireland.

Through a network of specialist treatment centres, CCLG members aim to provide the best possible treatment for all children with cancer and leukaemia, wherever they live, and as close to home as possible.

Survival for children with cancer has improved from less than 10% in 1970 to around 75% now. Nowadays, one in 1,000 adults is a survivor of childhood cancer. This is largely due to the clinical trials and laboratory research conducted over many years by members of the CCLG. Our aim is to cure even more children and we are working hard to ensure a normal future – both physical and emotional – for these survivors.

The Children's Cancer and Leukaemia Group was formed in 2006 as a result of the merger of the UK Children's Cancer Study Group and the UK Childhood Leukaemia Working Party, both of which had been in existence since the 1970s.

A new group, Friends of CCLG, was set up early in 2011 as a means of bringing together under one umbrella the many supporters of CCLG. By registering as a Friend, your name is added to a database so that we can keep you updated on progress in our work. (A separate leaflet is available or visit our website).

What we do

The CCLG supports the 1,700 children who develop cancer each year in Britain and Ireland. As an association for all healthcare professionals involved in their care, it works to benefit children through development of the highest standards of care. Many activities contribute towards this goal: education, liaison with governments and other bodies, information provision for families and healthcare professionals, the promotion of research, networking and meetings.

CCLG supports research in a number of areas, including tissue banking and biological studies. We are always very pleased to discuss with donors any requests to ringfence donations to support work in specific areas or tumour types.
